Winter is coming!!!

On December 28, 2015, a 42-year old miner with 3 years of experience was killed at a surface gold mine when two loaded haul trucks attempting to climb a snow covered access road slid backwards striking the driver side cab of the miner's haul truck.

- Best Practices for winter driving
 - Maintain control of equipment by making allowance for poor visibility and icy roads
 - Consider using tire chains for better traction
 - Maintain appropriate following distance to allow for corrective actions
 - Pull to a safe location if the road conditions are dangerous



Naming the Unnamed at 10,200 Feet

The Journey to Understand the Lives and Deaths of 19th Century Irish Immigrants Buried in Pauper Graves in Leadville, Colorado.

This talk will explore the history of Leadville's 19th century Irish community, the largest between the West Coast and Midwest, and to memorialize hundreds of Irish immigrants buried in sunken, unmarked graves in the Catholic Free section of Evergreen Cemetery.

James Walsh is an Associate Professor in the Political Science Dept. at the University of Colorado Denver, where he has taught for the past 24 years, specializing in Labor, Immigration, Community Organizing, and the Irish Diaspora. Walsh is co-author of Irish Denver and author of soon-to-be-published Michael Mooney and the Leadville Irish.
